

# **Mohammad Ali Jinnah, Great Advocate of Social Justice and Equality**

Today, we are celebrating 135<sup>th</sup> birthday of the Father of the Nation, Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah. Truly, it was the vision of our great Quaid that had laid the basis for the concept of an Islamic Social welfare state, which is a need of hour today.

Pakistan happy and prosperous, we should wholly and solely concentrate on the well-being of the people, and especially of the masses and the poor.” Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah dreamt about Pakistan with equal opportunities and equity in the distribution of resources, for all specially the masses, to live a meaningful life.

This vision of Quaid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah is still very much relevant and in fact, there is a dire need to implement his vision in its true spirit. It is worth mentioning here that the first democratically elected Prime Minister of Pakistan Shaheed Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto and his daughter Shaheed Benazir Bhutto sacrificed their lives for realization and practical manifestation of the same vision and aspirations of Quaid-e-Azam Mohamamd Ali Jinnah, transformed into Pakistan Peoples’ Party’s manifestation of “Roti, Kapra aor Makan – Elm, Roshni, Sab ko kam”.
